ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY	The Catholic University "Our Lady of Good Counsel" (UKZKM) is a private non-profit Higher Education Institution founded in Tirana, Albania, in 2004. Accredited by the Albanian Ministry of Education and the UK Quality Assurance Agency it was officially recognized as a Catholic university in 2011. Guided by its founder principles, Foundation "Our Lady of Good Counsel", present in Albania from 1993, which contributes to Albania's social, economic, and cultural development through higher education and healthcare services (Hospital, Dentistry, Polyclinic and Sports and rehabilitation Centre), UKZKM aims to offer EU-level undergraduate and postgraduate education, supporting Albania's integration into the European Higher Education Area. Partnered with several Italian public universities, UKZKM offers joint and dual degrees recognized across the EU, fostering a unique academic environment where Albanian and international faculty and students collaborate. UKZKM comprises four faculties: Medicine, Pharmacy, Economic, Politica and Social Sciences, and Applied Sciences. Additional centers include the Observatory of Health Systems in the Balkans, European Centre of Peace Science, Integration and Cooperation (CESPIC), Research Centre in Human Sciences (CRISU), and International Centre for Nursing Research Montianum (CIRIM). In partnerships with Albanian and foreign institutions and memberships UKZKM is also engaged in health cooperation, research, cooperation and development projects in different sectors. In the academic year 2024 – 2025, there are 3100+ students enrolled at all study cycles (1st, 2nd, 3d and 27% international ones), 3000+ alumni and about 470 Italian and Albanian academic and research staff.

RECOMMENDED LANGUAGE SKILLS	The language of instruction is both Italian and English (for study program in Medicine). A minimum recommended proficiency level of B1/B2 is required.*	
	Staff can teach in Italian and/or English. The minimum required level (for non-native speakers) is B2*, but C1 is recommended, unless otherwise specified in the interinstitutional agreement. 	It is recommended that the sending institution provides support to its nominated candidates and officially declares their language proficiency level before the study, teaching, or training mobility. Alternatively, students/staff can submit an official certificate.	
LANGUAGE COURSES	Upon request, the University Language Centre offers students the opportunity to develop their knowledge and specific skills in Italian, Albanian, English, and German. It organizes intensive, general, and sector-specific scientific terminology courses throughout the year at affordable fees.	





The academic year officially begins in the second week or mid-October.

Lectures are conducted over two semesters:

First Semester: October – January Second Semester: March – June

Examinations typically take place during:

Winter: February/March Summer: June/July

Autumn: September/October

The organisation and evaluation system of the Courses is based on ECTS credit system in order to allow students mobility across the European Community and validation of the exams taken abroad. 1 CFU (University Educational Credit) used at UKZKM according to the Italian system, equals 1 ECTS credit. Each credit consists of 25 hours of activity that includes frontal lessons, laboratory practice, seminars and individual study.

ECTS credits: 1 full academic year has 60 credits and 1 semester has 30 credit. For Undergraduate and Master level, examinations assessment is expressed in grades calculated on a scale of 0 - 30 with the possibility of awarding 'cum laude'. Pass grade and lowest mark for examinations is 18 and maximum grade is 30 (cum laude).

CREDIT AND GRADING SYSTEMS

As far as the final dissertation is concerned, a 110-point grading scale is used where 66 is the minimum passing grade, and cum Laude is added to the maximum grade to praise outstanding results.

For some activities like language courses and/or at choice courses or seminars, students may not be given a grade but merely a "Idoneo"/"Pass".

MINIMUM/MAXIMUM OF ECTS	A minimum of 24 ECTS and a maximum of 30 ECTS per semester must be included in the Learning Agreement for studies.
NOMINATION/APPLICATION	Partner institutions are responsible for selecting students and staff and must submit official nominations by the agreed deadline stated in the Inter-Institutional Agreement (IIA) via email to: erasmus@unizkm.al. Once nominations are received, UKZKM will communicate its admission decision within 5 weeks. Students will then receive detailed instructions on how and when to register for courses at UKZKM. For staff mobility, the teaching/training mobility plan and schedule must be agreed upon at least two months in advance. Nomination deadline for students: First Semester 31st of May (for mobility that takes place from October to February) Second Semester 30th of November (for mobility that takes place from March to July)
TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS/ ATTENDANCE CERTIFICATE	A Transcript of Records for students or equivalent certificate will be issued by UKZKM no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished. The certificate of attendance for students and staff will be issued at the end of the studies/traineeship/teaching/training period. period.
